## A TALE OF TWO SCHOOLS

□ Last year we reported a desperate situation at Namarita a remote village in rural Zomba. Hundreds of children were being deprived of schooling because the nearest school was so far away. We responded by building a brand new school, now fully operational, with 14 teachers, 385 pupils and a very able administrator who was once the coach of the Malawian National football team! All pupils are fed daily, along with many other needy children from the surrounding villages. The school benefits from a playground and sports ground, as well as land for crops and livestock. Grateful thanks to staff and foster parents of "Partners in Parenting", Willingham, Cambs for their valued partnership in this endeavour.




UMODZI SCHOOL, meaning "PARTNERSHIP SCHOOL", NAMARITA, RURAL ZOMBA.
