Our Child Welfare Officer was called to Neno police station to rescue three children who were given shelter in a cell after a good Samaritan took pity on them and asked for help. Sadly their story was not a happy one as they had been completely abandoned and left to fend for themselves in a house that was



ready to fall down around them. They waited for three days, alone, hungry and frightened before the eldest, aged only seven, decided to take his young siblings and set off in search of food. Although very weak with hunger, they managed to walk 20km before being found. As soon

as they were safe, they all fell into an exhausted sleep on the concrete floor of the police cell. Happily now settled at our children's centre at Namisu, they will be able to be children again and not worry about where their next meal is coming from.

Amazing Grace!



Grace is just ten years old and already faced struggles in her young life after her father deserted the family and left them in a state of extreme poverty. She attends our Philip Veale centre in Gomani on a daily basis where she receives hot meals, school uniform and after school lessons in our purpose built classroom. At such a young age, Grace has to shoulder the responsibility of looking after her two young siblings after school so her mother can try to

find some casual labour to earn a few kwacha to buy food. Without the support of the Lifeline Fund, Grace's mother would not be able to afford to feed her family. Always willing to raise her hand in class, Grace is such an inspirational, bright little girl who rarely misses a lesson.....even if it means bringing an adorable passenger with her!
