Our Skills Training Centre has never been busier with courses to suit everyone. With 60 students being trained over 2 courses, places are highly sought after. Currently we are teaching hairdressing in one classroom and motorcycle mechanics in another. All students leave with a TEVETA (Technical, Entrepreneurial and Vocational Education and Training) accredited qualification which enables them to have an advantage when seeking employment. Some students even decide to form small cooperatives and start their own businesses. We wish them all the very best of luck.



Unused in the UK...



...And now feeding hundreds of children in Malawi!

We have now sent 3 containers from the UK to Malawi, with a 4th currently being packed ready to make the journey in 2025. The contents of the containers have had such a positive impact on hundreds of lives. The 2 commercial polytunnels that were no longer being used and stood covered in brambles and nettles are now providing food for our whole primary school at Namisu 12 months of the year. Simply amazing!



Sustainable Agriculture

We are currently training individually selected lead farmers in conservation agriculture. We train 30 lead farmers per group in all aspects of soil management, seed planting pits, compost making, moisture retention and pest control. All the methods we teach are sustainable, organic and use resources already available to the farmers. These lead farmers then take the knowledge they have gained and select 25 local farmers from their own communities and teach them the methods they have learned. In total, after 2 years, our training will have reached more than 4,000 rural farmers who all rely on subsistence farming to feed their families.



An expert in Braille!

24,000 Trees Planted.....and counting!



Deforestation is a huge problem in Malawi and one that we take very seriously, To offset the firewood we use to cook meals for the children, we plant thousands of home-grown indigenous trees each year. We also provide local communities with the resources they need to replicate our successful tree growing project to enable many more thousands of new trees to be planted.

Infant Rescue Program



The first Monday of each month is a very special day.....it's the time for all babies registered on our infant rescue program to come to the clinic at Namisu to be weighed and receive a health check. Sadly, it's not uncommon for mothers-to-be to die in childbirth due to lack of medical facilities or complications during delivery. The orphan baby is left with a family member, sometimes a grandmother, who is herself struggling to survive. We also support mothers who are malnourished and unable to produce enough milk for their infants. They all bring their beautiful babies and collect soap, sugar, baby clothes and the formula milk powder, essential for the survival of the baby. As soon as they graduate onto solid food, they make way for another newborn to join the program.
